If you can't be here for a Sunday, the sermons are available on the church website to listen to. We have had trouble recording them clearly so just know the problem you are experiencing is not on your end. I also want to **encourage you to be a part of the Bible study on the Apostles' Creed on Sunday morning after the service.**

The interview chat sessions (50+) have been helpful in understanding some of the problems that COS has lived through. The sermons and Bible studies are very important for everyone to take in, as things like **learning to think about WHAT you are thinking about** and studying the **basics like the Creed** help us see the truth of God's Word and how our Missouri Synod Lutheran positions are based on that Word. We are a theologically conservative church body, but not every issue or situation is clearly black and white. Clarity, understanding and love and compassion all need to be present when dealing with issues.

**We need to learn how to stand firmly on that Word and still reach out in warm and loving ways to share the love of Jesus with all.**

**A Transition Team is being formed.** It should include all current, past, and future leaders in the congregation as well as interested members who will make the commitment to be at the meetings. The duties are to assist and guide me in the Intentional Interim Ministry process, attend the monthly study and discussion meetings, be willing to purchase a copy of *"Healthy Congregations"* (Peter Steinke – under \$20). I'll discuss the possible time slot for these meetings with Council on Feb 26.

Keep praying for me to have clarity and wisdom, for relationships to be healed and reconciled, and that we all harken to the Lord's way through this time.


