Victory in Christ

The Lord brought about a great victory... 2 Samuel 23:10

It is always a big deal when a new pastor comes to a church. It is also a big deal when a pastor leaves. It is easy to see his arrival as a victory, and his departure as a defeat. I do not believe that is the case, because in all things God has given us victory in Christ.

In the swirl of questions and doubts (and even misinformation) there are messages of gloom and failure and "who can show us any good" (ala Psalm 4:6). Let me clearly state what are not the reasons for my departure. I did not leave because COS is a bad church, or because I threw up my hands in frustration, or because I was fired or pushed out. As the Lord calls my family and I on to our next chapter in the Wisconsin Synod, and I look to a new chapter of ministry, possibly even starting a PhD program, I felt like I was able to leave with a good conscience because God has blessed COS in many ways. In fact, my time here has been a time of joy and victory in Christ, and COS has shared in this victory. Let me count some of the ways I've seen Christ victorious at COS.

The Word of God was preached and taught in truth and purity. And, the Word of God did not return empty. I saw sinners (and that includes all of us) repent, turn their lives around, and grow in the knowledge of Christ and in love for one another. I saw people confess faith in Jesus, become God's children through the waters of baptism, and become disciples of Jesus. One of the biggest victories I saw was God given unity. God granted us a stronger unity in faith. There was unity around God's word as we sat at the Lord's feet, and as we took the Lord up on his invitation to taste and see that the Lord is good. There was growing unity in the mission of making disciples. And there was unity achieved in the body of Christ as hurts were healed and as we encouraged one another in the faith.

Christ centered unity in the church is vital. An old Chinese proverb says, "Where there is unity there is victory." Likewise, Jesus says, "If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand" (Mark 3:25). Therefore, with the help and power of the Holy Spirit, strive to live together in unity. Not a false unity that pretends sin and problems don't exist. Rather, let it be a true unity that only comes from Christ as we submit to His word. Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers (and sisters) dwell in unity, says Psalm 133:1.

Strive, then, as scripture encourages us "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:2-3). Peter, in his epistle, reiterates the same thing saying, "Finally, all of you, have unity of mind, sympathy, brotherly love, a tender heart, and a humble mind. Do not repay evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary, bless, for to this you were called, that you may obtain a blessing (1 Peter 3:8-9).

Another victory God gave us was unity in prayer. We bowed heads together. We waited expectantly on the Lord. We reaped the joy of answered prayers. Continue, then, to pray expectantly, and wait patiently on Him. We've learned that God is good and loves to hear our prayers. Theologian A.W. Tozer writes, "The church that is not jealously protected by mighty intercession and sacrificial labors will before long become the abode of every evil bird and the hiding place for unsuspected corruption. The creeping wilderness will soon take over that church that trusts in its own strength and forgets to watch and pray." Therefore, do not cease to be a praying congregation.

I would be remiss if I failed to warn you that the church is living in perilous times, and there are wolves who will tear apart the flock if they are able. This is nothing new. Even Paul warned the Ephesians church saying, "I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock" (Acts 20:29). Watch out for those who cause division, those who tell lies and whisper behind backs, and those who reject the word of God. These are not the fruit of the spirit (these are boldly displayed in the sanctuary so I don't need to restate them here). As Scripture tells us in Titus 3:10-11, "As for a person who stirs up division, after warning him once and then twice, have nothing more to do with him, knowing that such a person is warped and sinful; he is self-condemned."

Finally, please allow me to encourage, entice, or urge (which ever you need) those of you who are thinking about pulling the escape hatch and leaving COS at this time. Whether because of uncertainty or disappointment, it is tempting during times of transition to look for greener lawns, fairer pastures, or better equipped campgrounds. You have a church home, and your church home needs you. You have been blessed and fed and discipled at COS. Now is the time for you to bless, feed, and disciple others. Support and encourage one another, especially your elders and church council as they support you. Just as you have needed your church home, your church home needs you now. Later, you will look back and joyfully see that striving for a little while together with your church family through both thick and thin is a great blessing with lasting impact.

Thank you COS for calling me to be your pastor, even for this short season. Your love, and encouragement, and faithfulness, and joy in the Lord has left a deep mark on me and my family. As we turn the page, the COS chapter will be remembered with joy. I was blessed and privileged to be your pastor. Thank you for giving me that opportunity. You will continue to be a blessing to each other and to your next pastor.

My own words are so feeble, but God's words are powerful. Therefore, as both my prayer and parting blessing to you, I share the words of God from Philipians 3:14-21.

I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith-that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.
